The Book Of Hebrews

The Five Warnings From God – Pastor Charles A. Hall – February 9, 2023

In the book of Hebrews the author conveys very strongly five (5) warnings that believers should be on guard against.

Included within this very comprehensive book of Hebrews are five danger signals given in the form of warnings. These warnings are like danger signs, that warns against the danger of continuing beyond a certain point. To proceed beyond the point of warning would be considered an act of disobedience to the command that have been conveyed.

The warnings that are written in the book of Hebrews become progressively worse for those who do not adhere to the warning. The warnings in the writing of Hebrews start out simple, like warning believers against being careless or taking our salvation for granted, about being indifferent or not caring about spiritual things, until we finally get to a point where we are totally satisfied with being indifferent (unconcerned) and careless (reckless).

- 1. Chapter 2:1-4 The danger of drifting.
- 2. Chapters 3:7 The danger of Disobedience Chapter 4:13
- 3. Chapter 5:11 The danger of immaturity Chapter 6:20
- 4. Chapter 10:26-31 The danger of willful sin.
- 5. Chapter 12: 15-29 The danger of indifference to the point of denial.

Warning #1 – The author is stating that the readers must give serious consideration to what he is saying, or they will drift way from Jesus Christ, and His free gift of salvation.

Warning #2 – If we continue in disobedience we will reach a point where there is no return, and then we become subject to the divine judgement of God for our actions.

Warning #3 – This warning deals with those who become stagnated in their spiritual growth, in fact there is no signs of growth at all, we become like a body of water that does not move, it become defiled and good for nothing.

Warning #4 – The forth warning deals with willful sin, sin that we commit even though we know the difference between right and wrong. In other words we know what the word of God says, but we willfully follow our flesh rather than our spirit. The real danger is that at some point our willful and overt sin starts to reflect the manifestation of who we really are.

Warning # 5 – At some point if we continue in sin we will become indifferent (unconcerned and uncaring), which then leads to denial. Being in denial is when we start to convince ourselves that what we are doing, and the way we are living is not wrong even though it is outside the will of God. The real danger is that we are subject to the judgement and wrath of God for living a life in opposition to His word.
