


I thank God for His Now Faith that is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen, because I never imagined being afforded such a prestigious honor as being set aside as one of God's and the Church's Servant Leaders. When I look back over my life, and I think things over, I can truly say that I have been Blessed! All I can say is thank you, God for the gift of this assignment, and thank you to Pastor Charles A. Hall, for being a true Man of God, and having an attentive ear to the unction of Holy Spirit, to lead and guide this branch of Zion called the St. John Baptist Church of Alexandria!

Before the foundation of the world, God promised Brother Mayfield to his loving parents, William and Edna Mayfield, who were grounded in the word of God. Brother Mayfield not only lived in the Church, but he also lived and grew up three floors above the Glad Tidings Baptist Church in Brooklyn, New York, which was co-pastored by his great aunt, Marie, and her husband, Fitz Carter. Deacon Freddie Sellers

Deacon Freddie Sellers was born in Cheraw South Carolina to Sister Lizzie and Fred Sellers. The Lord blessed brother Freddie with ten siblings, five brothers and five sisters; the Lord has called some of them home. Deacon Sellers's parents were believers of Jesus Christ, and as a result brother Freddie was baptized at an early age at the Macedonia Baptist Church. Freddie left home at the age of sixteen seeking greater opportunities for his life. He arrived in Alexandria, Virginia in 1976, and was able to secure a job with Frazer Brick Company located on Fayette Street in Alexandria. It was also in Alexandria that he met the love of his life, sister Ondria Griffin, they were married in 1991, and God has blessed this union with thirty-two years of marriage. Deacon Sellers is the proud father of two daughters Tamala and Eda, and a stepson Ricardo. Prior to his death, Deacon Sellers truly enjoyed spending time with his brother Yarn, who was also his best friend. In 1995, Deacon Sellers started working for Kesterson Plumbing, where he is currently employed. Even on the job Deacon Sellers is always looking for an opportunity to share his love of Jesus Christ, and to share his personal testimony.

Deacon Sellers joined the St. John Baptist Church under the leadership of Pastor Pointer. However, it was under the leadership of Pastor Charles A. Hall that Deacon Sellers started to grow closer to the Lord, while surrendering more of himself to the Lord. Deacon Sellers is a tireless worker within St John, his steadfast commitment and dedication to the Facility Care Ministry is a living testament to Freddie's love of God and His people. In 2016, the St. John Baptist Church selected and appointed Brother Sellers as a Deacon in training candidate, and he has satisfied completely the requirements for this position as called out by the word of God. Deacon Sellers is a faithful prayer warrior, who has served as a prayer platoon leader within St John. Deacon Sellers is a living example of a humbled servant of the most high God.

Deacon Charles Jones Jr.

Charles Jones Jr. was born on May 29, 1945, in Alexandria, Virginia to the late Charles Jones Sr. and Mildred Jones. God has blessed Deacon Jones with seven children, one daughter, and six sons (1 deceased). Charles was educated in the Alexandria City Public Schools System. Charles enlisted into the US Army during the Vietnam War on March 23, 1966, and transitioned to civilian life on December 18, 1967.

In 1973, Charles began working for the City of Alexandria in the Recreation & Parks Department. After five years, he transferred to the Sanitation Department where he remained for an additional eight years. In 1993, Charles joined the Department of the Interior National Park Service and served as a long-tenured employee for 20 years, until his retirement in 2013.

As a native of the city, Charles is referred to as an “*Old Time Alexandrian*,” in his leisure time he loved to gather with the guys, which did not leave him much time for God. For many years, he lived a life separated from God, and on his way to hell. However, one day by the grace of God he heard the true gospel preached by Pastor Charles A. Hall at his cousin’s homegoing. Although he had heard the gospel many times, this time it was different. This was on a Saturday, the next day he honored a commitment he made at the homegoing to attend Sunday service at St. John Baptist Church, where he accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior, and has never looked back.

In April 2014, Charles joined St. John Baptist Church and was baptized by Pastor Hall on May 1, 2014. Almost immediately, Brother Charles became a faithful worker in the church, and a resolute church van driver. He took immense joy and satisfaction in picking up and taking care of St. John’s Seasoned Saints Ministry members who rode the van to worship service.

In April 2016, he was called to serve in the Diaconate Ministry. Deacon Jones is a faithful and tireless servant at St. John while serving in various capacities to include in the Facility Care Ministry, assisting in the food distribution program as well as being a prayer warrior and serving as a prayer platoon leader. Deacon Jones knows that he is the recipient of an abundant amount of Grace, as a result he realizes that there is much expected of him.

Minister Myron Contee

Minister Myron Contee is the only son of Mr. Earl and Virginia Contee. Myron's parents were God fearing Christians who raised him and his beloved older sister the late Gwendolyn Elmore with Christian values. Born and raised in Alexandria, VA, Myron attended T.C. Williams High School and graduated in 1974. After high school Myron embarked on a journey at George Mason University (GMU), whereby the grace of God he was a standout basketball player. For many years, Myron lost sight of his Christian upbringing and as a result he drifted away from God. Thank God, that God never lost sight of Myron, nor did God ever forsake him, His hand was always on him. In 1994, Myron heard the gospel preached at Tabernacle Baptist and a significant transformation occurred, and Myron surrendered his life to the Lord. In the process, God brought him from the lowest time in his life to a new life in Jesus Christ. Myron began volunteering with the Good News Jail & Prison Ministry at the Alexandria Adult Detention Center, offering spiritual guidance to inmates.

He would later be licensed to preach the gospel in 2000, under the leadership and guidance of Pastor Jeffery Wheeler at the Tabernacle Baptist Church in Alexandria. Through the abundant grace, and mercy of God, Myron was able to attend Capital Bible Institute to formally gain a deeper understanding of His Holy Word in 2004. By the grace and favor of God, God allowed Myron to serve faithfully at Tabernacle Baptist Church for 18 years. In 2013, the Holy Spirit led Myron to join the St John Baptist Church, under the mentorship of Pastor Charles A. Hall, who is also a son of the Tabernacle Baptist Church. Under the leadership of Pastor Hall, Myron has surrendered more of himself to the Lord, and he has continued to grow spiritually. Minister Contee is a committed servant of the Lord at St. John and participates in many ministries, including Trustee, facility care, food bank distribution, and serves as a prayer platoon leader. He is also an able preacher and teacher of the Word of God when called upon.

In 2010, Minister Contee was appointed as the Alexandria Jail Chaplain by Sheriff Dana Lawhorne. His Bible-based programs have touched the lives of inmates, staff, and their families. Myron understands the abundant grace that was given him, and as a result he works tirelessly to reach back to give others a helping hand in any way that he can. Myron has received many awards for his community service, however, for Myron it not about the rewards, but rather lifting the Name of Jesus whenever and wherever he can.

Myron is blessed to be married to sister Angela Contee, and together they have four children, and eight grandchildren. By God's grace Myron is blessed to be an entrepreneur, which has allowed him the opportunity and privilege to use His business to help others and to glorify God. He is incredibly grateful for his journey thus far and desires to continue by the grace of God to be usable for whatever God calls him to do.

The Call: Acts 6:1-7

And in those days, when the number of the disciples was multiplied, there arose a murmuring of the Grecians against the Hebrews, because their widows were neglected in the daily ministrations. ² Then the twelve called the multitude of the disciples unto them, and said, It is not reason that we should leave the word of God, and serve tables. ³ Wherefore, brethren, look ye out among you seven men of honest report, full of the Holy Ghost and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business. ⁴ But we will give ourselves continually to prayer, and to the ministry of the word. ⁵ And the saying pleased the whole multitude: and they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Ghost, and Philip, and Prochorus, and Nicanor, and Timon, and Parmenas, and Nicolas a proselyte of Antioch: ⁶ Whom they set before the apostles: and when they had prayed, they laid their hands on them. ⁷ And the word of God increased; and the number of the disciples multiplied in Jerusalem greatly; and a great company of the priests were obedient to the faith.

The Qualifications: 1 Timothy 3:1-13

This is a true saying, if a man desire the office of a bishop, he desireth a good work. ² A bishop then must be blameless, the husband of one wife, vigilant, sober, of good behaviour, given to hospitality, apt to teach; ³ Not given to wine, no striker, not greedy of filthy lucre; but patient, not a brawler, not covetous; ⁴ One that ruleth well his own house, having his children in subjection with all gravity; ⁵ (For if a man know not how to rule his own house, how shall he take care of the church of God?) ⁶ Not a novice, lest being lifted up with pride he fall into the condemnation of the devil. ⁷ Moreover he must have a good report of them which are without; lest he fall into reproach and the snare of the devil. Likewise must the deacons be grave, not doubletongued, not given to much wine, not greedy of filthy lucre; ⁹ Holding the mystery of the faith in a pure conscience. ¹⁰ And let these also first be proved; then let them use the office of a deacon, being found blameless. ¹¹ Even so must their wives be grave, not slanderers, sober, faithful in all things. ¹² Let the deacons be the husbands of one wife, ruling their children and their own houses well. ¹³ For they that have used the office of a deacon well purchase to themselves a good degree, and great boldness in the faith which is in Christ Jesus.

The Ordination:

The purpose of ordination is to recognize men whom God has called, chosen, appointed, anointed, consecrated, and elevated for the work of ministry with more responsibility and accountability through biblical teaching and instruction.
